The Lord Mayor will open this year's civic remembrance event, with a speech which will reflect upon his visit to Auschwitz in Autumn 2022. He will be joined by Wojciech Soczewica, CEO of the Auschwitz-Birkenau Foundation.

The event will include an interview with Arek Hersh MBE about his experience of being chosen to be painted by Massimiliano Pironti as one of the seven portraits of Holocaust survivors. commissioned by King Charles III.

Leeds Heritage Theatres' Leeds Actors in Training (LAIT) have created a performance for the event inspired by the graphic novel Irmina by Barbara Yelin, which explores in a few chapters the ways in which 'Ordinary People' stood by and ultimately allowed an event such as the Holocaust to take place.

There will also be music by Rabbi Alby Chait and the UHC choir and a memorial prayer will be sung.

The event will conclude with a reading of the seven statements of commitments with candles lit by representatives of the different groups persecuted, including Holocaust survivors, people with additional needs, the LGBT+ community and Remembering Srebrenica.
